DRIVER ASSESSMENT CLINIC

Under section 47j of the *Road Traffic Act 1961*, the Clinic assesses all second and subsequent offenders who have been charged with driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs or exceeding the prescribed concentration of alcohol within a three year period. The Clinic also assesses drivers for alcohol and/or other drug dependency who have been referred to it by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles under section 80 of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959*.

Provides an integrated approach to reducing the harms which can arise from drug use. Undertakes community development and harm reduction education and training, with an emphasis on amphetamine and party drug use, heroin use and overdose, and injecting drug use. The unit is also responsible for the coordination and management of the Clean Needle Program. This program aims to prevent the transmission of HIV and other blood-borne viruses among people whose injecting drug use behaviour places them at risk.

PHARMACOTHERAPIES UNIT

Offers methadone and buprenorphine maintenance programs as well as outpatient counselling for opioid-dependent clients, assisting them to reduce or abstain from the use of illicit opioids. Outpatient counselling services are also available for stimulant and other drug problems. The unit is also the point of referral, liaison and support for private prescribers and community pharmacists. Specialist education and training is provided to health professionals working in the alcohol and other drug area and in the generalist health services.
